### Show Jumping Class Definitions

**PLEASE NOTE - All classes will be run using the following format (as previously adopted for the Stars, Advanced and Intermediate Classes)**

#### **A2 - ARTICLE 238.2.1**

Table A class over one round against the clock. Riders jump all obstacles. Placings are according to penalties and time taken. In the event of equality of penalties then time will be used to determine place.

#### **GRAND PRIX - ARTICLE 273.3.3.1**

COMPETITION OVER TWO ROUNDS - This Competition comprises, with the same speed, two courses, identical or different, either in track or in number of obstacles or in the dimensions of the obstacles. Each Athlete must participate with the same horse. Athletes, who have been eliminated or who have retired during the first round, may not take part in the second round and may not be placed. **All the Athletes go forward to the second round** according to the conditions of this schedule. The second round is usually run in reverse order of penalties in the 1st round. Any rider who completes the first round but does not participate in the second round is placed below all riders who start in round 2.

#### **Individual and Team Scoring:**

- Points will be allocated in the A2 class from 35 for first, 34 for second etc and the Grand Prix Class from 70 points for 1<sup>st</sup> 68 for second, 66 for third and so on. The championship (jackpot) on the day will be awarded to the rider with the most points from both the A2 and Grand Prix classes.
- The VEIS series winner is the combination with the highest points from two qualifying events and the series grand final, which is weighted times 1.5.
- Team Championships - will use the following system of scoring. The best 4 scores from each school count for the school points. Points will be allocated on the basis of 10pts for 1st, 9 pts for 2nd and so on to 1 pt for 10th place in each championship level to a maximum possible score of 40.

## **RULES OF COMPETITION Eligibility and Insurance:**

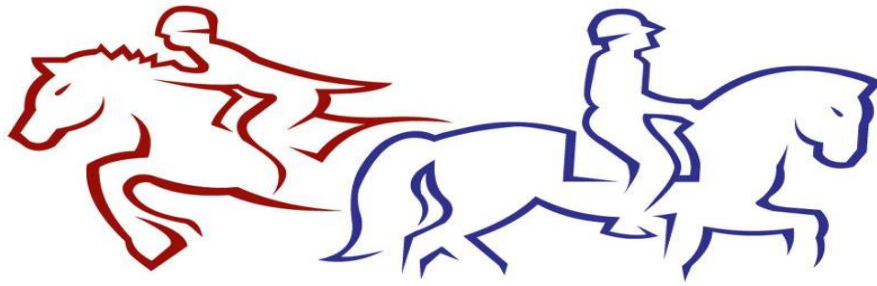
- This competition is affiliated with Equestrian Australia (EA). EA rules apply where appropriate to interschool competition and can be found at [www.equestrian.org.au](http://www.equestrian.org.au) or [www.vic.equestrian.org.au](http://www.vic.equestrian.org.au).
- This competition is open to all currently enrolled primary and secondary school students.
- A current EA number or PCAV number is required for insurance purposes.
- No riders, other than those competing, are allowed to ride on the grounds.
- Stallions, colts and rigs are not permitted at any VEIS events. The definition of a stallion includes those chemically castrated.
- One horse, one rider rule applies. Riders may ride more than one horse.
- Schools must nominate a suitably experienced Team Manager. Team Managers are responsible for Gear Checks. Inappropriate gear will result in elimination.
- All riders MUST be accompanied by an adult.
- All riders must wear currently approved and tagged EA helmets (according to current EA rules) and riding boots while mounted. School equestrian uniform must be worn in all competition and for presentations.
- Classes may run later or earlier than advertised. Riders are expected to be aware of changes to times and report accordingly. Riders who do not report in time to ride in their draw order may be eliminated.
- All appeals must be lodged by the Team Manager on the official form available from the organising committee, no later than 30 minutes after the incident accompanied with \$50.00, which will only be refunded if the protest is upheld. All appeals will be considered by the Jury of Appeal on the day.
- The Committee reserves the right to alter or delete any classes, and refuse entry with or without a reason.
- Entry only accepted with full payment.
- LATE ENTRIES may be accepted and will incur an additional \$10.00 per entry, which will be paid at the time of entering.
- A \$20 administration fee will be deducted from all SCRATCHINGS. After closing date, as per EA rules, a vet/doctor's medical certificate is required for return of entry money, less \$20 administration fee.
- All riders must present at the Secretary's office before they compete on the day.
- All riders must provide their own numbers as per the draw, and these must be worn on both sides of the bridle or saddle cloth.
- Any rider deemed to be riding in the incorrect level will be eliminated.
- No motorised scooters or motor bikes are allowed. Only 1 rider per bike. Helmets must be worn at all times when riding a bike.
- Competitors and spectators must abide by the WPNEC Safety Guidelines at all times. These can found at <http://wpnec.com.au/safety/>
- **Volunteers are welcome**  
The VEIS is a volunteer group. Volunteer help is needed to run the event. The organising committee is asking that all families provide the name and phone number/email of one volunteer for the day. Signup may be used to allocate jobs if required. Jobs include set up on Friday 17 June, marshalling, pole pickup, course changes, pencilling, and packing up of jumps at the end of the day. If you do not wish to provide a volunteer, please donate \$20 (which will be part of the Event Secretary entry).

The top 2 series placegetters, in National divisions, will gain a place on the Victorian Team for the Australian Interscholastic Championships. Riders must compete in one other round of the series to be eligible.

**We need your help** – The VEIS is a volunteer group. As part of the success of interschool competitions,

assistance is needed. As this final is not hosted by a school, volunteer help will be needed. Schools with more than 3 or more riders will be have blocked volunteer job to share between families who have not opted out of volunteering. Volunteers who do not complete their duty may cause their rider to be eliminated from the competition and any scores and results will not be included. A levy payment of \$50 per family is offered on the online entry in place of volunteer assistance. This income will be used to pay pencillers to enable consistency in using the online scoring.

\* Prix St. Georges and Intermediate 1 (PSG & Inter 1) qualification: Horse/Rider combination must have competed at Advanced Level in two separate tests and have gained a minimum of 57.5% to be eligible to start in PSG and Intermediate.

PSG and Inter 1 will be the "Small Tour". Championship Points will be awarded to the "Small Tour". Alternately, riders may compete in PSG and 1 Advanced, however, this combination of tests will not gain any championship points.



# Rules of Competition

## Eligibility and Insurance

- This competition is affiliated with Equestrian Australia (EA).
- This competition is open to all currently enrolled primary and secondary school students. Please supply a current EA number or PCV number (PCV book must be presented on the day) on the entry form.

## Conditions

### **Important note regarding Preparatory Dressage:**

Preparatory tests are for children that are in the early years of Primary School and are beginners or inexperienced riders. Please do not enter these classes if the rider:

- is graded or has competed higher than PCV 5.
- can canter confidently.
- has ever competed in jumping classes with starting height above 45cm.
- competes regularly and independently in showing classes.
- has placed 1st-4th in Preparatory Dressage or a showing class at any Interschool State Championship or in any VEIS Grand Final in Preparatory level.

**Riders cannot compete in both Preparatory and Preliminary Dressage. Please note that entries will be checked for compliance.**

- EA Rules apply. These can be found at [www.equestrian.org.au](http://www.equestrian.org.au) or [www.vic.equestrian.org.au](http://www.vic.equestrian.org.au)
- No Stallions or Rigs are permitted at any VEIS Interschool Competition.
- Schools may nominate a suitably experienced Team Manager. If there is no Team manager parents and riders are responsible for gear checks. Inappropriate gear will result in elimination.
- All riders must be currently enrolled at the school they are representing and be accompanied by an adult.
- All riders must wear currently approved EA helmets and riding boots while mounted. School equestrian uniform including white, beige, fawn or banana jodhpurs must be worn in all competition and for presentations. Gloves must be worn.
- No riders other than those competing are allowed to ride on the grounds.
- One horse, one rider rule applies. Riders may ride more than one horse
- Classes may run later or earlier than advertised. Riders are expected to be aware of changes to times and report accordingly. Riders who do not report in time to ride in their draw order may be eliminated.
- A \$10 administration fee will be deducted from all SCRATCHINGS. After closing date, as per EA rules, a vet/doctor's medical certificate is required for return of entry money, less \$10 administration fee.
- Horses must be entered in their correct EA dressage grade. Any rider deemed to be riding in an incorrect grade will be eliminated.
- All appeals must be lodged by the Team Manager or rider representative on the official form available from the organising committee, no later than 30 minutes after the incident, accompanied by \$50, which will only be refunded if the protest is upheld. All appeals will be considered by the Jury of Appeal on the day.
- All riders must provide own numbers as per the draw, and these must be worn on both sides of the bridle or saddle cloth.
- The Committee reserves the right to alter or delete any classes and refuse entry with or without a reason.
- All riders must present at the Secretary's office before they compete on the day.
