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# 1 Introduction

The Victorian Equestrian Interschool Series (VEIS) handbook describes the rules and principles under which the VEIS operates.

The VEIS operates under Equestrian Australia (EA) rules, regulations and polices as they apply to interschool competitions and in alignment with Interschool Victoria (ISV) and Equestrian Victoria (EV) policies and guidelines.

The VEIS runs events for Dressage and Jumping under the discipline rules for these disciplines and other policies and guidelines including:

- Equestrian Australia Codes of Conduct
- Child Safe Code of Practice and EA Child Safeguarding Policy
- Equestrian Interschool Victoria General rules

## 2 What is the VEIS

#### The VEIS is committed to:

- providing a safe and supportive environment for dressage and show jumping competitions for primary and secondary students and
- supporting the development of quality equestrian competitions that foster talent and skill development

The VEIS is an incorporated organisation run by a committee of volunteers. The VEIS committee consists of representatives from 3 regions- Northern, Barwon and South East – and includes event organisers for series competitions.

The VEIS committee meets approximately four times a year.

#### 2.1 VEIS Events

The VEIS facilitates the running of a series of eight events each year.

These include three 'qualifier' events and a grand final in dressage and in showjumping.

The VEIS aims to promote a Dressage and Jumping qualifier event in each region.

The champion and reserve champion series winners in 'national qualifier' levels qualify for the team to represent Victoria at the Australian Interschool Championships.

### 2.2 VEIS Website/guidance

The VEIS website provides

- guidance to help organisers comply with current standards and expectations for running VEIS Interschool horse events
- VEIS series calendar of events and series scores
- Links to current policies, rules and guidelines and the ISV handbook



#### 2.3 VEIS Event guidance

VEIS events are governed under the following rules:

- EA rules
- ISV handbook including any rules that over-ride EA rules (e.g. no stallions are allowed at interschool events)
- Specific rules that apply to VEIS events. These include:
  - 1. Schedule of classes see Appendix A (dressage) and B (show jumping)
  - <u>Champion exclusion rule</u> Rider and horse combinations who have been Individual VEIS Champions may not compete in that level in subsequent years.

(In exceptional circumstances, exemptions may be given to this rule. For consideration of an exemption, riders must apply to the VEIS Committee prior to 31 January).

This rule does not apply when riders move from primary to secondary school levels or have reached the top level i.e. PSG/Inter 1 dressage and Stars (120cm) jumping.

3. VEIS scoring -

Dressage – riders must attain a minimum of 57.5% in a test, to obtain a qualifying score for points.

Show jumping – the 'grand prix' is scored double the points of the A2 class. VEIS Grand Final – points awarded at Dressage and Jumping Grand Finals are multiplied by 1.5 (i.e. the Grand Final is worth 50% more than other qualifying rounds).

# 3 Event organiser requirements

#### Who can run events for VEIS?

Any suitable incorporated organisation that:

- is affiliated with EV
- has insurance (which may be through EA)
- has a commitment to meet the required standards expected at Interschool events as outlined in the ISV handbook including Child Safe and medical requirements.

#### Entry fees for VEIS events must include the following:

- o a levy of \$2 per rider/horse combination at VEIS qualifier events
- o a medical levy of \$10 per rider (to be paid into the VEIS medical levy fund)

#### 4 VEIS dates

VEIS dates are set by the VEIS committee in consultation with ISV. Requests to host a series round must be sent to the Committee in the year prior between June and September.



#### 5 VEIS Levels

Required levels and classes for series rounds are specified in the Appendices of this Handbook. Any level that is divided into junior, intermediate and/or senior may be run as one class. Rider year levels will be applied for state team selection as per Interschool Victoria rules.

#### **VEIS Scoring**

- Rider/horse combinations score points for the VEIS Team and Individual Championships at the VEIS Qualifier events (4 dressage and 4 show jumping qualifier events)
- At each VEIS qualifier event a champion and reserve champion award is awarded for the top two placed competitors at each level.
- The VEIS Grand Final event is open to all riders but to score individual or school series points, combinations must have competed at one or more series qualifying competitions. To place in the VEIS series and therefore be eligible for Victorian Team selection through the VEIS, riders must have competed at a minimum of two VEIS series events, which may include the Grand Final
- In the Grand Final, any horse/rider combination must compete at the highest level that they have competed at during any Qualifier event. This rule will not apply to the first qualifier event in any given year or series.
- If one round of the VEIS series is cancelled (for any reason) the scores from the other 3 events in the series will be counted. If the Grand Final is cancelled the three rounds/events that have been held are weighted equally. The Grand Final coefficient of 1.5 will remain if this event is run.
- If a VEIS series event is shortened on the day (for example due to bad weather), all classes completed will count for individual series scores. No school scores will be included in the series for that round.

#### **Dressage**

- Rider/horse combinations may only ride 2 dressage tests and points are awarded as per EA rules
- Riders must achieve 57.5% in a test to be awarded points
- If a rider competes one test at Advanced and one test at Prix St Georges, then they will be counted for points based on their Prix St Georges placing (i.e. riders will only earn individual and team points for the Prix St Georges, no points will be awarded for an Advanced test competed at the same event).

#### <u>Jumping</u>

• The 'Grand Prix' jumping class is run over 2 rounds and is scored double points i.e. 35 points to the winner of the A2 (article 238.2.1) and 70 points to the winner of the Grand Prix (article 273.3.3.1).

#### **School Teams**

• School points are awarded based on a rider's total score in the championship (i.e. their ranking across the two tests at the same level, or two jumping classes). The winner of the championship will score 10 points, Reserve Champion 9 points, and so on down to 1 point for 10<sup>th</sup> placing. The maximum a school can score is 40 points- 4 individual Championships



# 6 Qualification for the Victorian Interschool team

- The series champion and reserve horse/rider combinations from the VEIS qualify for a place in the Victorian team at national qualifier levels.
- Where the same horse/rider combinations have already qualified for the Victorian team through the Equestrian Victoria Interschool state championships, the next best qualified rider will be offered the spot according to the ISV team selection policy.

# APPENDIX 1 DRESSAGE

VEIS Dressage competitions are run under current EA dressage rules. The current rules are effective 1 January 2023: <a href="https://www.equestrian.org.au/dressage-rules">https://www.equestrian.org.au/dressage-rules</a>

See the ISV Team Selection Policy for information on how to achieve qualification for the Victorian team for the Australian Interschool Championships. Note that selection is based on the year level of a student at school.

Rider/horse combinations must score a minimum of 57.5% in a dressage test for the combination's score to accrue points for the VEIS team or individual championships. If the minimum 57.5% is not attained in a test no points will be gained for that test.

The allocation of points for championship placings and series scores at VEIS events is consistent with EA Interschool Dressage scoring:

- Points are awarded 35 points for first placed horse, 34 points for second and so on to the last-placed horse.
- The aggregate points over the two classes determines the Championship placings.
- In the event of a tie for Championship placings, the higher placing is awarded to the
  combination with the highest aggregate percentage over the two tests. In the event of a
  further tie, the higher placing is the combination with the higher percentage score in the
  more advanced test.
- In the event of equal placings in a test, no half/split marks are allocated. The equal placings receive the same points, then the next placing and points are skipped. i.e., 2 riders finishing equal 4th receive 32 points, with the next placing being 6th receiving 30 points. If a clear winner or placing is required in a class for individual tests the best total of the 4 collective marks would place higher.

#### **APPENDIX 2**

#### **SHOWJUMPING**

Showjumping is run at VEIS events under current FEI and EA National Jumping Rules.

See the **ISV Handbook** for information on general rules for equestrian interschool events and qualification for the EA Australian Interschool Championships. The procedure for Victorian team selection for the Australian Interschool Championships is outlined in the **EV Interschool Selection Policies and Procedures**.

Note: Victorian team selection is based on the year level of a student at school. VEIS series scores will indicate the rider's year level to clarify selection to Primary, Intermediate, Senior or Secondary team places.

The jumping classes offered at VEIS events are:

#### One Round Table A- (Article 238.2.1)

• Athletes with equality of penalties are placed in accordance to the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread in accordance with the provisions of the schedule. Please note — this is only if faults and times are exactly the same so it is very rare that this second round jump off is ever run.

#### "Grand Prix" (Article 273.3.3.1)

Competition over two rounds. This competition comprises, with the same speed, two
courses, identical or different, either in track or in number of obstacles or in the dimensions
of the obstacles. Each Athlete must participate with the same horse. Athletes who have been
eliminated or retired during the first round, may not take part in the second round and may
not be placed. All the athletes go forward to the second round according to the conditions of
this schedule. The second round may be in reverse order of penalties in the first round;
athletes retain their drawn order in case of equality of penalties. The second round is the
Jump Off. There is no extra jump off.

#### Scoring to determine championship placings and series scores

- In the A2 class, first place is awarded 35 points, second place 34 points, and so on down to 1 point for 35<sup>th</sup>.
- The "Grand Prix class" is worth double points so that first place is awarded 70 points, second place 68 points, and so on down to 2 points for 35<sup>th</sup> place.
- Points over the two classes are aggregated to determine places for the championship on the day for each VEIS qualifier, and for the VEIS series scores. In the event of an equality of points, points earned in the Grand Prix are used for the count back.
